Rule

>> Paalala (Reminder): When you find an item, you must say the Tagalog word aloud three times before checking the box!



Paruparo

Butterfly – Check the sky or flowers.



Langgam

Ant – Look for a trail on the ground.



Tipaklong

Grasshopper – Check long blades of grass.



Gagamba

Look for a web in the corners or bushes.



Ibon

Bird – Look up! Do you hear them singing?



Tutubi

Dragonfly – Look near water or open sun.



Uod

Caterpillar – Look under leaves. (Huwag hawakan/Don't touch!)



Gamu-gamo

Moth – Check shaded areas or near lights.

The “Sensory Challenge” (Adjective Prompts)

Humanap ng... (Find something...)

- **Matinik** (Spiky): Can you find a leaf or branch w w with thorns?
- **Malambot** (Soft): Can you find a petal or pipiece of moss?
- **Matigas** (Hard): Find a rock or a sturdy li branch.
- **Makintab** (Shiny): Look for a shiny beetle or a wet stone.
- **Mabango** (Fragrant): Find a flower thatat smells “**masarap**” (delicious/good).
